Title: Shaped for Impact Pt.1 - Pastor Harold McKenzie

Key Scriptures: Proverbs 22:6 (AMPC), Psalm 139:14, Ephesians 2:10 (NLT), John 14:16-17 (NASB), Ephesians 1:13 (AMP), Romans 8:15-16 (AMP), John 15:26, Romans 8:11 (NASB), Acts 1:8, John 14&16, Galatians 5:22-25, John 7:38, Acts 1:5&8, 1 Corinthians 2:4 (NASB), John 14:12, Acts 2:43, Acts 8, 1 Corinthians 6:19

Reflection Questions:

1. Father recreated us in Christ to do dynamic things for Him. How can the functions of the Holy Spirit mentioned by Pastor Mac help us do these dynamic things?
2. Many people ponder these questions: who am I, why am I here, do I have any value? How can the truths found in Romans 8:15-16(Amp), Ephesians 2:10(Amp), and Psalm 139 encourage us and lead us to the answers we need?
3. Galatians 5:22-25 is an example of one of the ways the Holy Spirit actively works in our lives to shape us for God's plan and purpose. Read this passage and discuss or reflect on what it means in your life specifically.
4. The Holy Spirit is the "S" in our S.H.A.P.E. Who is the Holy Spirit to us, and what are some of the ways He functions in our lives? See Ephesians 1:13, John 14:16-17 and Romans 8:11, 15-16.
5. As we consider the importance of the Holy Spirit in our lives, what role does having an active relationship with God play in maximizing His effect in our daily living?
6. List at least 3 ways you can help others thrive in their shape?

Key Scriptures: Proverbs 22:6 (AMP)/ 1 Corinthians 12:4-7,11, /1 Corinthians 13:8-19/1 Corinthian 14/
Ephesians 4:11-13

Reflection Questions:

1. Do you know your S.H.A.P.E and what do you think is your top Spiritual gift or gifts?
 - a. If you do know your Spiritual gifts, how do you envision God using them to advance His Kingdom and impact your work environment, family and community etc.?
 - b. If you're unfamiliar with the gifts, become deliberate about making the investment to seek and understand what they are. As you do, allowing the Holy Spirit to show you your Spiritual gifts and how He wants to use them through you.

Pastor Mac shared this list of spiritual gifts with us: prophecy, words of wisdom, knowledge, faith, miracles, healing, discernment, diverse tongues, interpretation of tongues, helps and services, teaching, encouragement/exhortation/mercy, giving and administration. Key Scriptures: Psalm 139:14 (NLT), Romans 12:2, Exodus 31:3-6, 1 Corinthians 12:6, Ephesians 4:16 (NLT), 1 Corinthians 12:15-17, 19, 21 (NLT), Ephesians 4:16

Reflection Questions:

1. Reflect on what you know about your Spiritual Gifts, passions, abilities, and personality. How have they influenced you and how you serve God?
2. How much have culture, money, people, or circumstances influenced your educational and career choices vs. your "Heart" and "Abilities"?
3. Based on what Pastor Mac taught, identify some of your strengths based on your God given shape, personality type and gifts?

Reflection Questions:

1. What are 2 experiences you've had that God has used to minister to someone else?
2. Reflect on some of your life experiences, how has God used them to specifically develop your faith, and strengthen your character?
3. What is your inner soundtrack when facing life's challenges? Do your thoughts and "self speak" immediately revert to worrying, doubt, insecurity, complaining, or faith, hope, confidence and trusting God's power in you?

Key Scriptures: Matthew 17: 16-20, Matthew 6:33, 1 Chronicles 28:5, Revelation 3:21, Ephesians 2:5-6, Daniel 7:14-18, 1 Corinthians 1:30, Philippians 3:7-9, Galatians 3:11, Mark 11:22-26, 1 Corinthians 15:57, 2 Corinthians 2:14, Mark 11:25

Reflection Questions:

1. Jesus commanded us to seek the kingdom first. Read the key scriptures and answer the following:
 - a. What is the kingdom of God
 - b. How is it described
 - c. How can we live in a deeper revelation about the kingdom?

2. Pastor Rick used the metaphor of having a four-pronged fork in the spirit, concerning prayer and faith .How can we become more effective with the power and authority given to us?
 - a. How does knowing “God is Here” with us empower us to walk in the authority He has given us?
 - b. What outcome can we expect when we speak the word of truth and believe that God’s word does not return to Him void?
 - c. Because of the cross, we are joint heirs with Christ, what did we inherit?

Reflection Questions:

1. The goodness of God is not dependent on us. God is the initiator. List 3 ways God has been faithful.
2. Are you serving the Lord with joy and gladness or out of obligation and routine? If out of obligation, why?
3. What are you holding on to (i.e. bitterness, hurt, hate) that is preventing you from serving Father boldly, loudly and freely?
