Title: Prayer: How Do You Plea - Pastor Vernon Davis

Key Scriptures:

1. Luke 18:1 / Genesis 1:26 / Psalms 115:16 / Jeremiah 1:12 / John 9:31 / Proverbs 15:29

Reflection Questions:

1. How is prayer two-way communication with God?
2. Considering **Proverbs 15:29 & Hebrews 4:14-16** - If God hears the prayers of the righteous, what gives you confidence that your prayers will be heard in times when you are struggling with sin or don't *feel* righteous?
3. Thinking of God in the role of the Judge according to **Luke 18**, why is the posture of your heart important when you approach God in prayer?
4. Reflecting on **Jeremiah 1:12**, what are some obstacles you're facing? List 3 scriptures you can apply through prayer as your "plea" to the court of heaven to impact your circumstance.
5. In light of **Psalms 115:16**, who does God want to use to advance His kingdom in the earth, and how can prayer help us partner with Him in doing so?

Key Scriptures:

1. James 1:22 / Jeremiah 29:10-14 / Deut 28:1-14

Reflection Questions:

1. What are some of the reasons you find it hard to pray, and why?
2. Read **Jeremiah 29:10-14**, then consider: if God knows the plans that He has for us, why do you think that He wants us to pray?
3. What is the importance of finding a solitary place to quiet your heart before God as you engage Him in prayer?
4. As you allow the Holy Spirit to shine light on certain areas of sin in your life? Are you in agreement with what He says about them? Do you allow Him to work on those areas?
5. Together we learned and applied 4 disciplines of prayer **1. stillness, 2. praise & worship, 3. repentance & confession, and 4. declaration**. Which disciplines do you need to apply more on a consistent basis? How can applying them regularly be a benefit to you?
6. The widow in Luke 18 had no other options or anyone else to help her. Are there areas or situations where you have trusted in a plan B instead of fully relying on God?

5. Reflecting on Daniel's daily commitment to prayer, what things can you do to create a more inviting prayer space and effective practice of seeking God's face? (i.e. dedicate a specific time or space, eliminate distractions, etc.)

Key Scriptures:

1. Deut 11:18-21, Acts 16:25-34, Exodus 12:24-29, Luke 11:1, Matthew 18:18-19, Job 42:7-10

Reflection Questions:

1. Take a minute to think about your family altar:
 - a. Write down what you envision it to be: what does it look like, what does it sound like and what are the results you'd want to see from it?
 - b. Ask God what steps you can take to make that vision a reality and make a note of them.
2. If you are single or live alone, who can you establish a prayer altar with and how can you go about establishing that?
3. What are the things you believe are standing in the way of you having a family altar, or improving an existing family altar? Ask God to give you solutions for those things, make note of them and take action on them.
4. What are the issues affecting your family, friend group or the world that you've talked about but not necessarily leaned into prayer about? How could family altar time impact those things?
5. How can family prayer be helpful as you face the realities and challenges of our day?

Key Scriptures:

Reflection Questions:

1. We must remember that Jesus was born human and lived a fully human life. Using Him as our example, how should the 7 reasons why He needed to pray impact how and when we pray?
2. How do we posture our hearts in prayer to be able to hear Him, when the only way **out** of a situation is for us to go **through it**?
3. In John 11:6, it said that Jesus stayed where He was 2 more days even after hearing about Lazarus. How do we discipline ourselves to listen first and respond second rather than the reverse?
4. Considering Martha and Mary, what is your response when it feels as if Jesus isn't concerned with your prayers? How can we continue to remain in faith while we await His response?
5. Reflecting on the poem "[No Time To Pray](#)", why is it important for you to begin each day in prayer?
6. Jesus prayed all night when it came to selecting His leaders. What are the decisions you need to make that may need additional prayer, and are you willing to wait for direction?

Reflection Questions:

1. God deals with sin because of how it affects our relationship with Him. If **we** truly value intimacy in our relationship with God, how should we deal with our sin?
2. Are there any areas where you have allowed unforgiveness to remain? Considering Matthew 6:12, why is it important to allow God to help you work through unforgiveness, division and bitterness?
3. Pastor indicated that we can side with the enemy based on how we handle disagreement and offense. List some ways we can disagree in a Christ honoring manner and work through offenses.
4. Read Matthew 6:25-34. What are some takeaways that help you trust the Father's heart toward you as you pray concerning your needs?
5. In thinking about "Connection, Integrity, Excellence, Influence", Pastor provided Joseph, Daniel and Esther as examples of how living in alignment with God increases your influence. In order to increase your influence, what thoughts, actions or habits do you need to change?

Title: With Jesus in the School of Prayer Pt.3 - Pastor Harold McKenzie

Key Scriptures: Matthew 6:13 / Matthew 21:21-22, Hebrews 11:6, Matthew 17:19-20, 1 Cor 5

Reflection Questions:

1. How can our feelings impede our choice to forgive? What can we do to process the feelings of anger, bitterness and resentment?
2. Do you have an accountability partner? If yes, how do you maintain the effectiveness of that relationship? If no, prayerfully consider who in your life could be one.
3. How can having a spiritual accountability partner be helpful in your effort to resist temptation and overcome sin?
4. Pastor Mac said: if you want to truly be effective in your prayer life, intercede for the salvation of others. Who are at least 5 people you can regularly pray for to receive salvation in Christ? Intentionally begin praying for them.
5. Why is praying in faith important, versus relying on our own abilities and resources, to accomplish God's will?
6. What things can you do to continue praying in faith when the answer God gives you is "no" or "not yet"?
